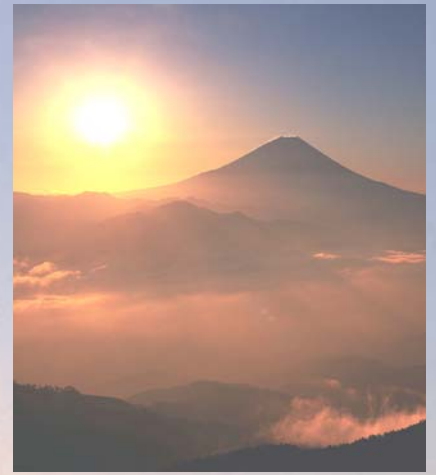


Retreats for Single Christian Men and Women
